⁵ For taxation years beginning in 2019, the small business deduction limit of \$500,000 will be reduced at a rate of \$5 for every \$1 of adjusted aggregate investment income (AAIL) in excess of \$50,000 in the prior corporate taxation year. The \$50,000 exclusion is shared amongst associated corporations.

⁶ The \$600,000 Saskatchewan small business limit is reduced by a ratio of the federal reduction (above) divided by the federal small business limit.

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
